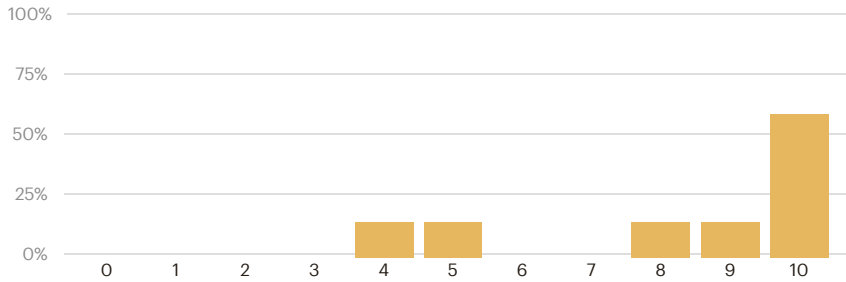

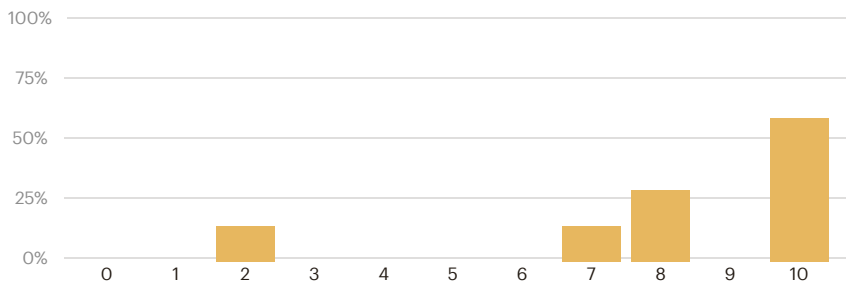

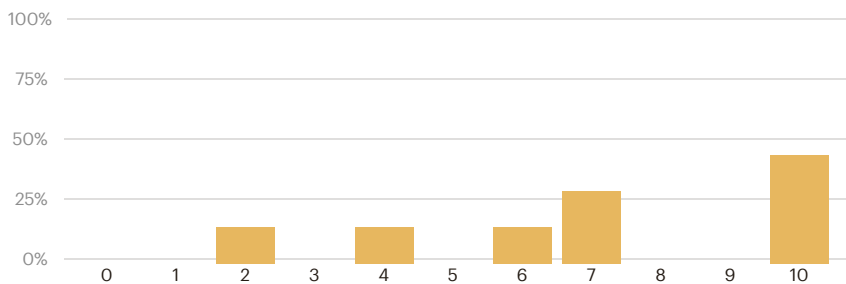

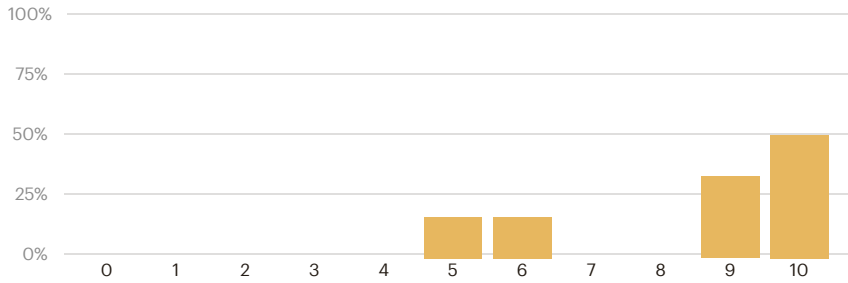

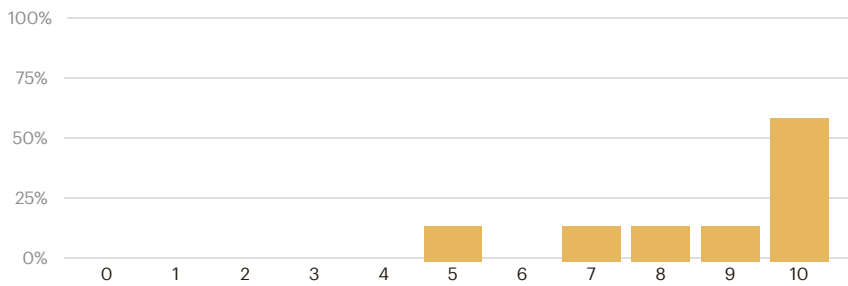

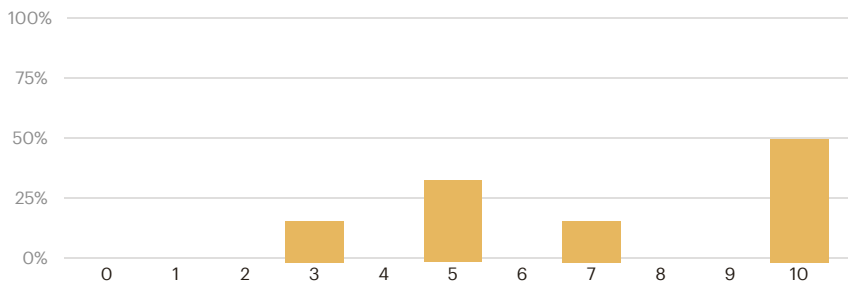
### “School maintenance facility”

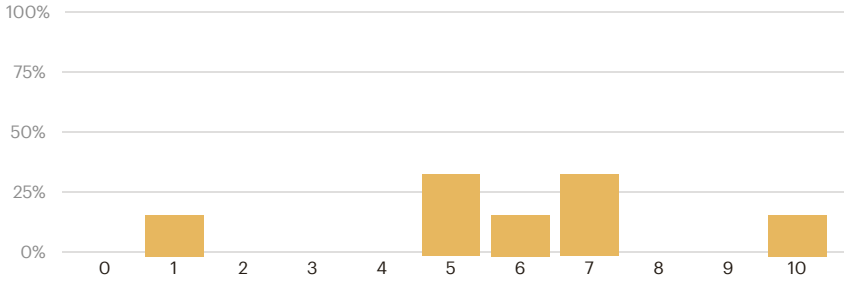
### “Community/senior center”
